

The word "Nottawasaga" is an Algonquin Indian word. "Nottawa" means "Iroquois" and "Saga" means "mouth of the river". The area of which this district is a part was Iroquois territory and the Algonquins occupied the Wasaga Beach area which is at the mouth of the Nottawasaga River. When the Algonquin Indian Scouts, posted at look-outs along the river observed Iroquois raiding parties approaching, they would pass along the word "Nottawasaga" meaning "Iroquois at the mouth of the river".
